

YE-Jodie

Last week 18 YE's got helicopter flights with Hans, and 1 other YE got a fixed wing flight. Subsequent flights cancelled due to deteriorating weather. Jodi will keep in touch on reschedule or not.

Next YE fly date is 12/21 and she set a limit of 25 participants.

1/18/20 YE fly date was added (see activities) as only Saturday available in January

Youth Program – John Weber

YP is running 5 to 10 Youth and 18 to 20 participants total every week. Number includes mentors and parents. It was noted that lunches are underfunded so we're negative on each session. It was discussed and agreed that the loss is part of the program. We'll try to work it down to less if possible, but a foreseen expense and not a lot to be done about it. Next YP session set for 12/7.

Projects

Wayne is helping Mark Banus on the Rebel. His experience is very helpful and they are making progress on the wings. Most all parts are now sorted and catalogued as well. Mark asked for \$500 for parts and after MM&S it was approved. Steve and Frank are moving along on the C150 and some engine parts will be ready to be sent out for inspection soon. Steve asked for \$1000 in order to do so along with purchase of tires/tubes for the project. After MM&S it was approved.

BD-6 project looks like it will be as complete as current materials allow in 2-3 weeks. Next kit has been requested from Bede Foundation but no word back from them and no kit as of this date. If project is at stopping point for lack of next kit, probably will be put upstairs for storage until next kit received in order to make more room in hanger. It's small and easy to move.

Greg and Ted making progress on the Air Camper. Covering materials have been purchased and fittings are being welded up for empennage covering. Greg also has the main landing gear legs and axles almost tacked up. When done we can pursue finish welding for them and move closer to getting the fuselage sitting on its own gear Marty, Wayne and Steve will be visiting Leeward Air Ranch on Sunday to look at a Piper PA-28, Cherokee 140 there that is a possible donation. More info after they get to look at it for a while.

Frank/Steve/John started a discussion about the path going forward with flyable aircraft like the C150 and Cherokee 140. A decision will need to be made within the Chapter about how to pursue a flying club, or work with an existing club to allow our YP participants to apply work hours to flight hours. How would it work? Does it meet our restrictions from National? What structure would it take? Who owns the aircraft and a number of other questions. After a brief discussion Joel suggested the members kick their ideas around and bring the best ones to the Board for consideration. The discussion was tabled for now.

Frank also expressed a concern that with 4 ongoing projects and maybe more we can't predict, we might find ourselves distracted and fragmenting our treasury on too many projects at once. It was discussed and generally agreed that the Chapter needs to be careful not to take too much on at one time so we can complete projects and sell or use, then move on to others, without depleting our resources too much. It's also difficult with too few projects to keep our YP participants busy as not all can work on one project all of the time. It's a balance we'll have to watch and adjust as needed. More on this as projects move forward.

There was also mention by Lee Helfer that insurance could become a deciding factor in formation of any flying club as insurers don't want anyone below the age of 17, and preferable 18 and the premiums required will reflect that by being really expensive. It will have to be researched some more and taken into consideration during any flying club discussions in future. The devil's in the details as they say.

Joel brought the membership up to date on our hanger lease renewal. He explained that he'd sent the Airport Manager a letter requesting a one year extension of our current lease, as allowed by our current lease, and is waiting for approval of the AAB and City Commission sometime he thinks by the end of January. He does not anticipate a negative response from the City but we'll have to pay attention. Next year we'll have to renegotiate a new lease.

Leesburg SPARK senior high school students toured the airport last week and also visited our hanger. Jodie and Joel were the only members there but they said the response from the participants was very good and much better than last year. More interest, better questions, etc. Good job and thanks to them for their efforts. The more we provide positive input to youth in Leesburg, the better. They also gave out a lot of YE information.

<u>Presentation</u> - was made by Steve Tilford about his trip around the US this summer.

Without further business before the Membership, the meeting was adjourned via MM&S at 11:29 am.
