- Feet flat on floor
- Yoke full movement
- Demonstrate how to egress in case of an emergency. Let them try it
- Sterile cockpit



A BEND in need creates a FRIEND indeed

We've been trying to form a set of flaperons for one of our members in the hanger and have had a hard time with finishing due to having to bend new skins for them and not having a good way to make an 8' long bend, until now. I recently spent a morning at Spencer Fabrications, Inc. in Tavares watching them make short work of our bend issues in their busy shop on a 12' long sheet metal brake. Jay Persuab, the owner, and I had talked a couple of times about the parts and earlier this week he said to be at the shop on Friday morning at 9 am and they'd see what could be done. I arrived on time and checked in with receptionist Liza Cacho. Then I showed the flat skins to Dennis Seibel in engineering and to brake operator Jay Conner. We talked about what they were and what they needed as far as a trailing edge radius and they chose the proper die set to use. While Jay Conner set up the tooling, Dennis gave me a tour of the shop. I've always enjoyed seeing how different shops work, and Spencer Fabrications is guite an outfit. They aren't huge but they're a tight knit group that's been together for many years. They offer a diverse range of capabilities for machining, laser and waterjet cutting, welding, assembly and finishing of a wide range of designs of their own, or contract work for others. They're successful at adapting, designing and producing with employees who are seasoned and work well together. When the brake was ready, and the upper and lower dies had been loaded, they carefully positioned each flat 8' long sheet of .032," 2024T3 aluminum between the dies exactly on the bend line and gently brought the two dies together to make a single 8' long bend which will become the trailing edge of one flaperon. They did it twice and now we've got two skins to work with, both with quality precision bends. I want to thank Mr. Persuab, Liza, Jay Conner and Dennis for their hospitality, thoughts and help in forming the skins we need to complete the flaperons. It was a pleasure to visit with them. I have also invited them to come and visit us for a tour of what we do.
